Adoption of the 2018 Comprehensive Plan

On **Monday, October 29**, the King County Council adopted the 2018 update to the 2016 King County Comprehensive Plan (Ordinance 18810).

At the meeting, the Council voted on amendments to the plan and then voted to approve the legislation, as amended. The amendments can be found on the Council's [Comprehensive Plan website](#). A final version of the approved plan will be posted online later this week. Adoption of the plan completes the Council's process of deliberation and public input on the proposal.
