



FALL CITY COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION JANUARY 2018 MEETING MINUTES

President Ashley Glennon welcomed attendees, called the meeting to order, reviewed the agenda, led the Pledge of Allegiance/Moment of Silence and invited those attending (nearly 40 people) to introduce themselves.

Minutes December minutes were approved as amended to correct the date of the original floaters count (2014) and to correct the amount Fall City Floating spent in 2017 on Trash Management Equipment and Non-Labor Expenses (\$4770).

Ashley, noting the strong turnout for the first experimental evening meeting, asked those attending to share concerns and ideas that they would like the FCCA to address. During the meeting the following issues were offered:

- “Clean up the river”, make it an asset, not a problem
- Install a Fall City Bulletin Board

- The new water district fee
- Beautify Fall City!
- How about a Neighborhood Night Out?
- Blind corners caused by bushes and hedges growing into the roadway
- Update on Wastewater Treatment

Community Information Event (Ashley shared that 16 groups were present, 20 represented and approximately 200 people attended last year’s Community Event.)

Overview and Purpose of the Fall City Community Association (FCCA)

The FCCA is one of four main community entities who work together to achieve common goals; the other three are Fall City Arts, the Historical Society and Fall City Parks. Ashley reviewed the Mission of the FCCA: “promotes building of community, proactively communicates on local issues and takes action on selected issues that affect the Fall City Community” and shared other information about the group’s work and structure.

Communication is supported through the monthly periodical “Fall City Neighbors”, the Fall City website and the Yahoo Group and “Nextdoor”. Ashley also shared some “fun facts” about Fall City and the historic city boundaries as well as boundaries for zip code 98024. He briefly reviewed highlights of the River Planning Discussion from the December meeting.

Ballots that allowed for write-ins for all current officeholders/nominees from the December meeting were distributed. FCCA Membership Reminder

Ashley reminded attendees that 2018 membership dues are \$30/person for a Regular Membership providing for voting rights and \$20/person for Supporting Memberships.

King County Update/CSA grant program According to Community Services Area Manager Alan Painter, the CSA (Community Service Area) grant program awards will be announced in the next few weeks. The County 2019-2020 budget is currently being developed and will be submitted in the fall to the King County Council.

Fall City/King County Stakeholder Group John Taylor of Water and Land Resources updated the group on progress of the Stakeholder group (including their intention to improve communication between the County and Fall City) and the County's desire to purchase significant resource lands. There was brief discussion about the impact of closing the campground and plans for the Rainier Recycler's property.

Raging River Conservation Group Update Sue Holbink shared about the group's focus and said the County has put a temporary stop on the Raging River Quarry's expansion. She invited those interested to volunteer with the group.

Next Meeting

After discussion, the group agreed to continue evening meetings for the next six months. The meetings will be held at the Fire Station from 7:00 – 8:30pm on the first Tuesday of each month. The next meeting is: **FEBRUARY 6, 2018.**
