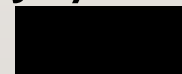

Fall City: The Heart of the Valley

What is it?

Created in 1984, this event presents an opportunity to build community-law enforcement partnerships that extend beyond emergencies or crisis; To make neighborhoods safer and more caring before disaster strikes.

Why is it important?

We can build a stronger, more resilient community together. WE can rewrite the narrative for our community! Think back on limited supplies during COVID, the rain and wind storms in September, the black out in February, and the most recent heat wave. This is why preparedness and an understanding of when/where/how to seek help is vitally important.



Fall City: The Heart of the Valley

How are we making it relevant to the Fall City Community?

There are three ways we hope to accomplish relationship building:

- Exposure to the wide array of resources that law enforcement brings to the area,
- A focus on emergency preparedness and,
- An emphasis on local business.

In addition, we have expanded our invitation to smaller agencies that strengthen our response posture and recovery such:

- Map Your Neighborhood Program (MYN),
- Community Emergency Response Teams (CERT),
- Assault resistance and abduction prevention.



Fall City: The Heart of the Valley

How do we make this happen?

We have identified sponsorship levels that are directly tied to one or more of the focus areas so our sponsors will know their direct impact on this incredibly important event!

- Flashlight:* \$500 Permitting fees, small business fees, live music fees (donation to band), bottled water, sanitation supplies (wipes, hand sanitizer, garbage bags)
- First Aid Kit:* \$1000 Local balloon designer, locally sourced marketing material, porta-potty rentals
- 6 Month Supply:* \$1,500 Feeds our first responders and volunteers, rental fees for kids' activity area
- Prepper Status:* \$2,000 Emergency kits (1 of 2), merchandise (silicon cups with logo)

How do we make this happen?

We are requesting seed money in the amount of \$2,500 - \$4,000 to pay for the essentials such as permitting, sanitation, and marketing.

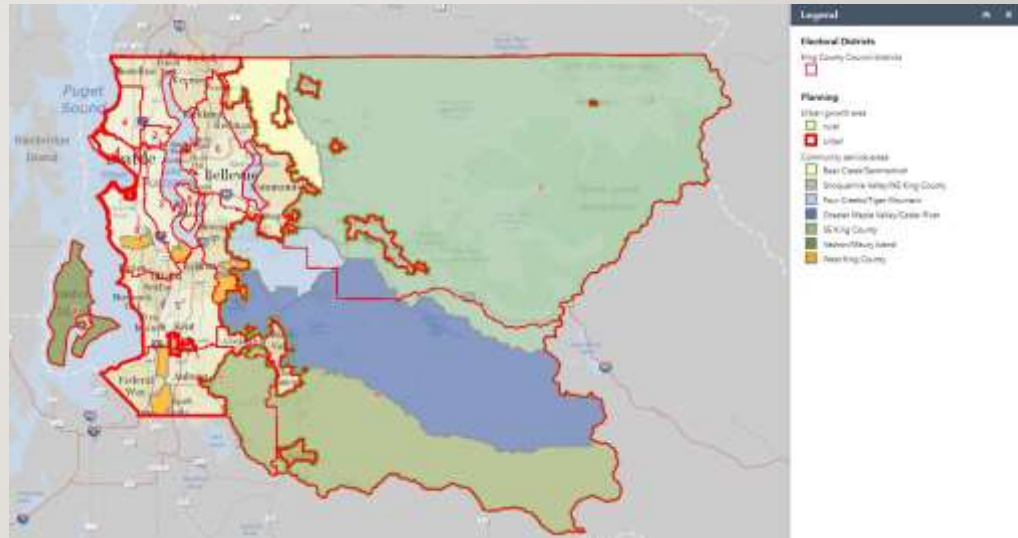
