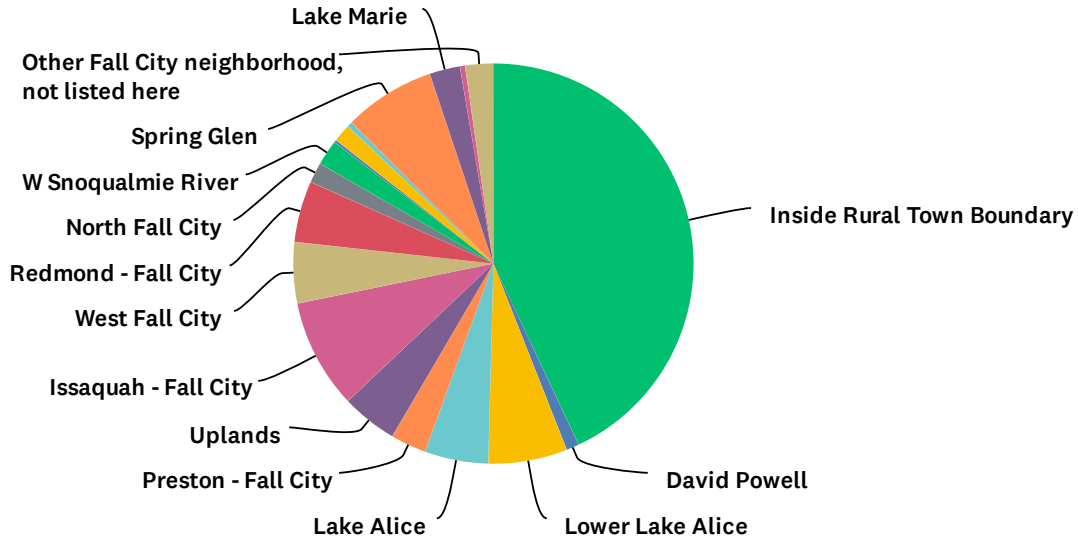


Q1 Do you live inside or outside of Fall City

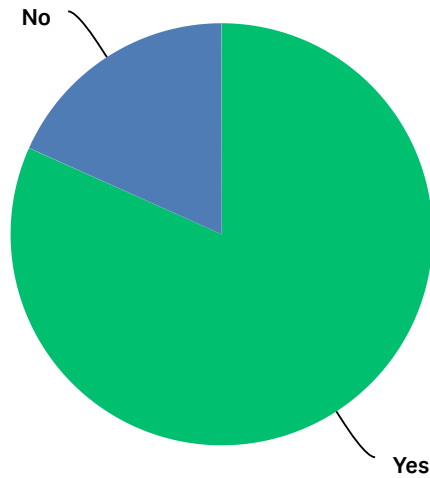

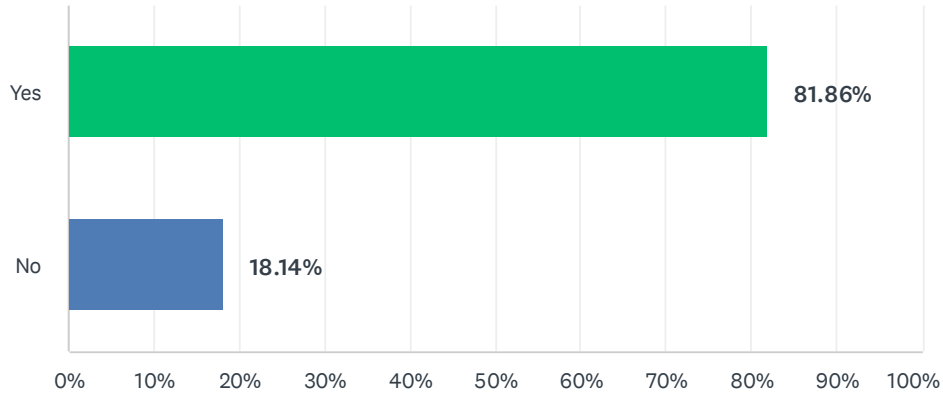

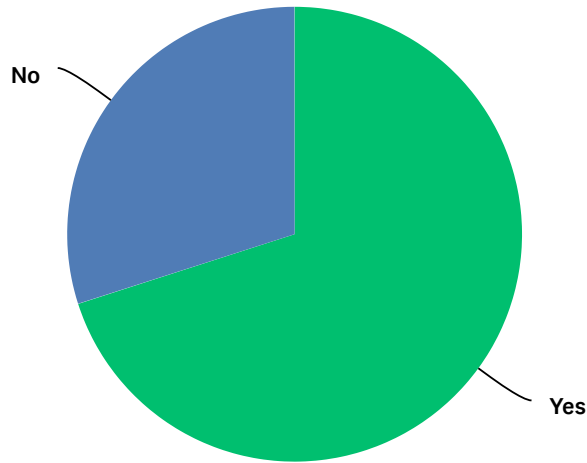

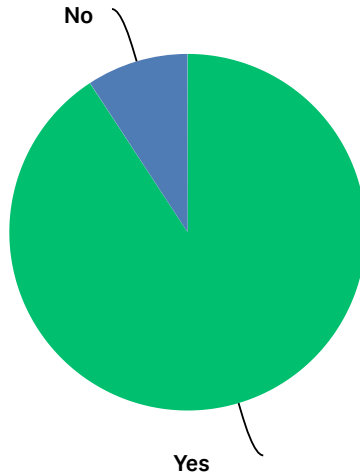

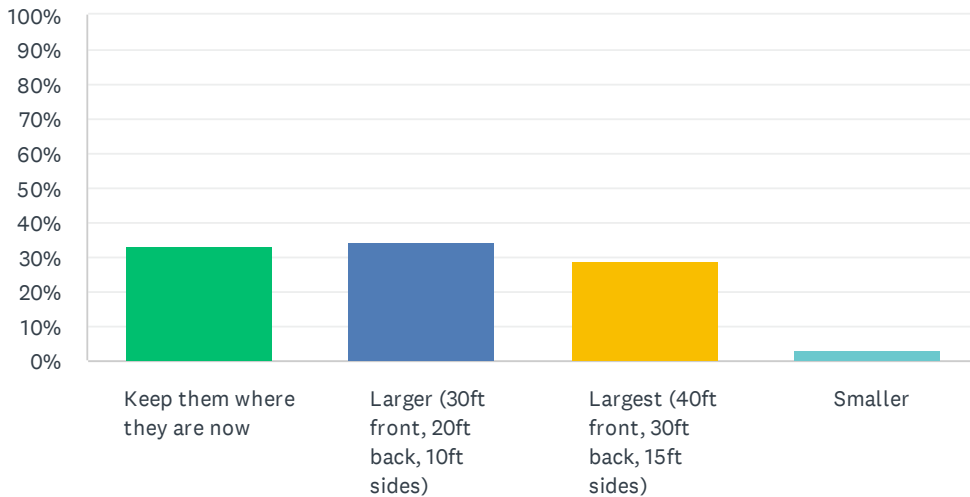

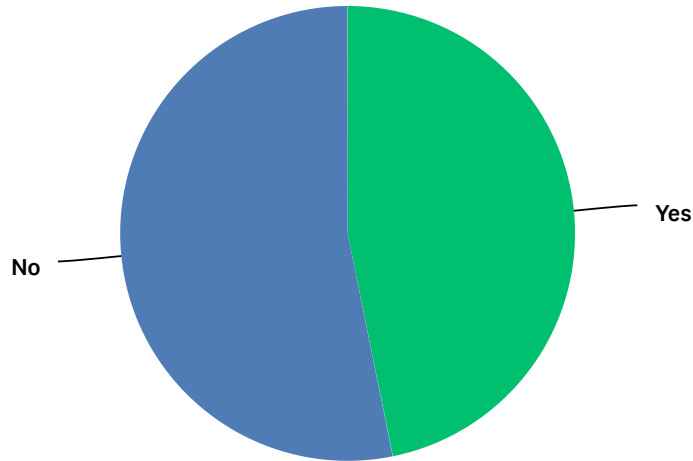

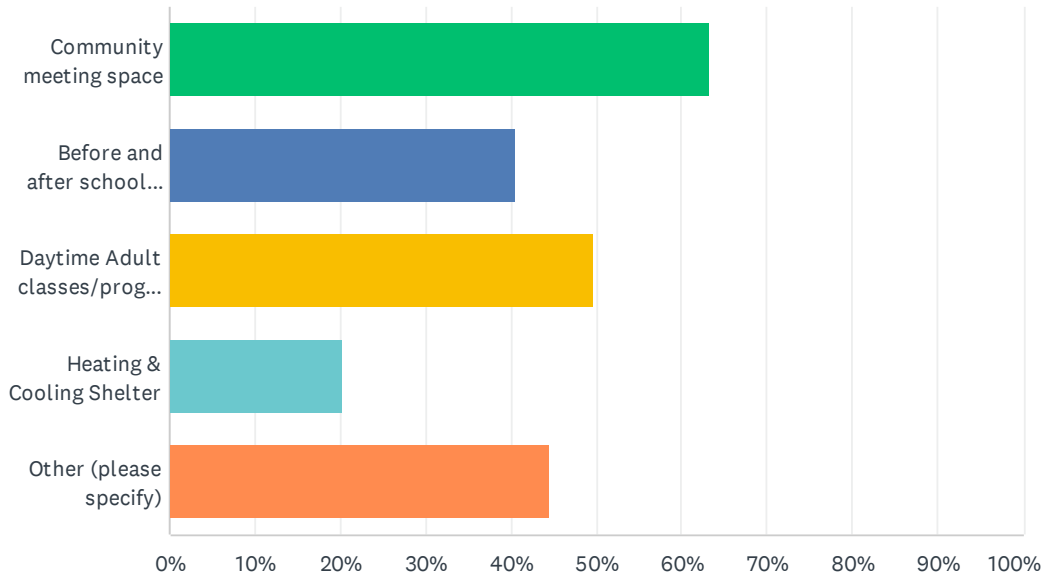

Q8 If Fall City needs a community center, what services would you use?

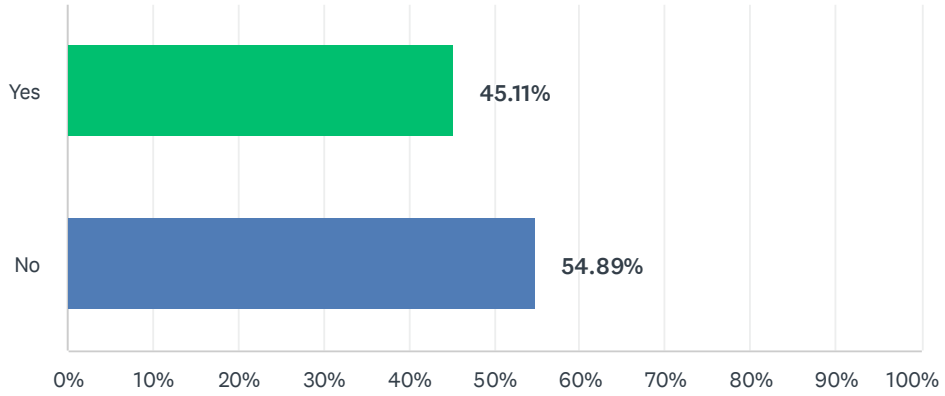

Q9 Fall City has no permanent public restrooms. Do you support public restrooms downtown?

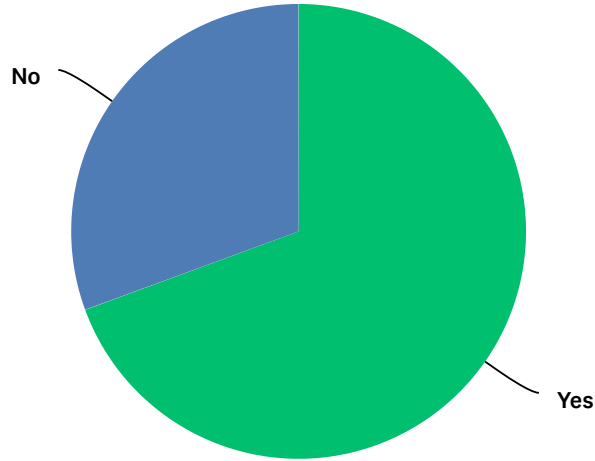

Q10 Fall City has no office or substation for King County Sheriff's Office or law-enforcement services. Should it?

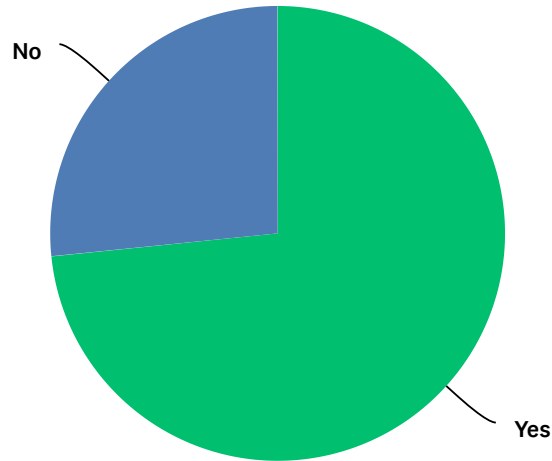

Q11 Do you support funding more King County law enforcement presence in Fall City?

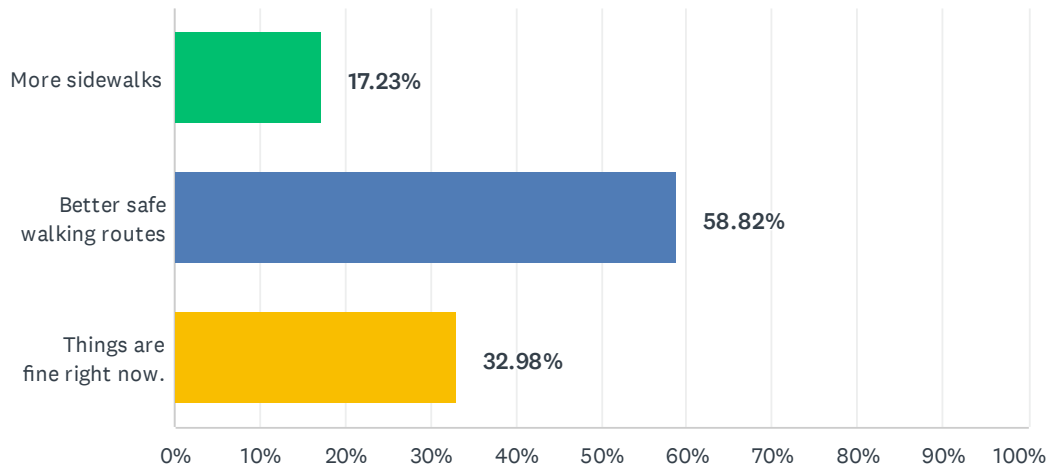

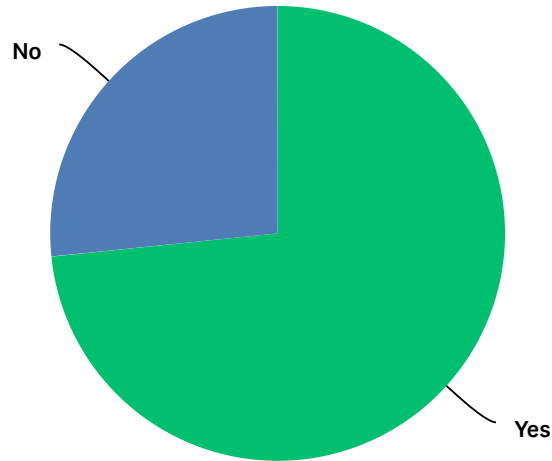

Q13 Do you support more trail and/or path access in Fall City and the surrounding area?

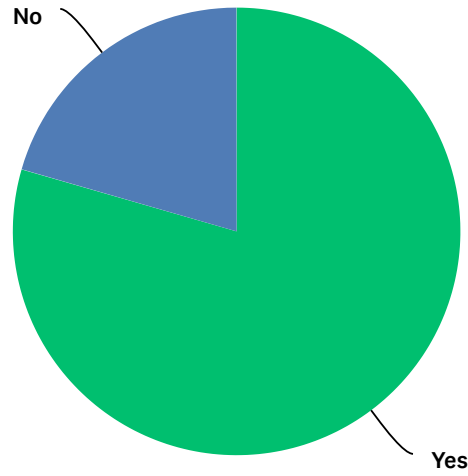

Q14 Do you support river levees being open as public walking trails or paths?

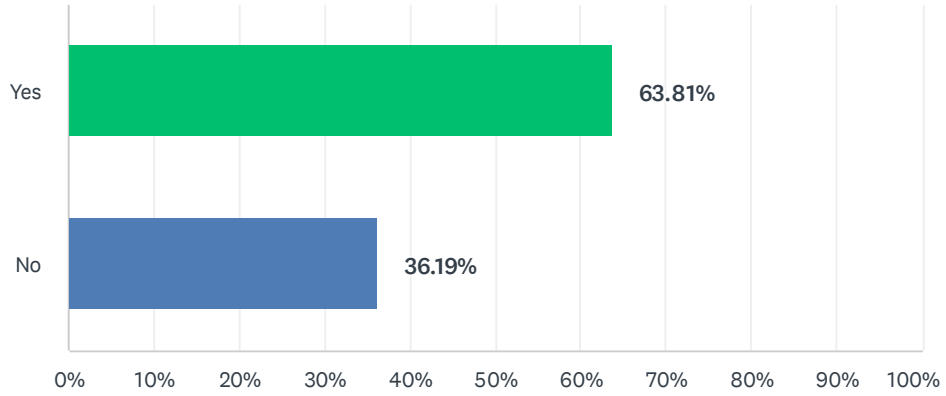

Q15 Do you support the state of Washington improving and expanding bike lanes on State Routes 202 and 203?

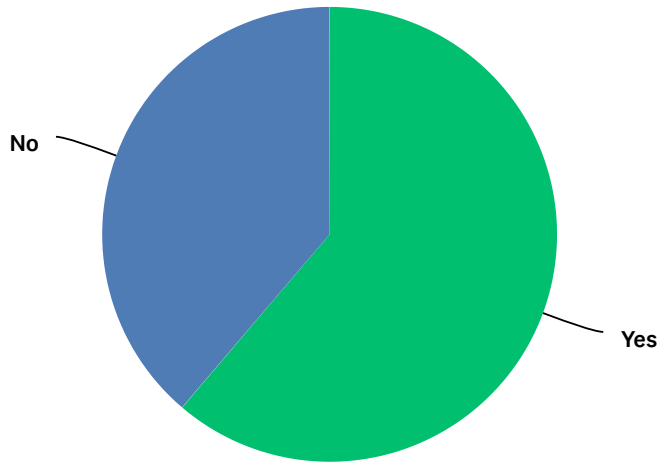
